Betty Louise (Hulett) Veno was born August 28, 1939 in Vancouver, Washington to her parents William and Clara Hulett, both of whom preceded her in death. She was the second of five children. digging clams, and she instilled this love for the beach in her children. She also very much enjoyed traveling, camping and being outdoors with her husband and children. Betty worked in a nursing home in Longmont, Colorado for 10 years.

She is survived by her husband John Thomas Veno, children James Veno, Michele (Veno) Sussex, Mary (Veno) Weingartner, John Andrew Veno, Susan (Veno) Kaps, William Veno, Paul Veno, Joan (Veno) Lukavich and Joseph Veno.
