Funeral Mass of Christian burial will be celebrated for Dahlia Marie Romo, 58, at 10am Thursday, November 18, 2010 at St. Rose Catholic Church with The Reverend Father Felix Martinito and Reverend Mr. Rolland Raboin officiating. Burial will follow in the Valley View Cemetery in Torrington. Visitation hours will be held at the funeral home on Wednesday from 1pm to 5pm. A Rosary/Wake service will be held Wednesday at 7pm at the church. The casket will be open at the Rosary but closed at the Mass.
