In 1980 when the mine shut down he went to work for the City of Torrington as a Landfill operator. He retired in 1998 due to ill health.

Richard enjoyed drinking coffee and visiting with friends, camping in the summer, and playing cards.

Richard is survived by his wife Donna of Torrington; daughters Carrie Burt and her husband Dave and Melanie Pyle and her husband Gardy all of Torrington; a son Ron Weimer of Torrington; three sisters Shirley Woodard and her husband Dick of Torrington, Sally Green of Gering, Nebraska, and Irene Kallis and her husband Arnold of New Leipzig, North Dakota; a brother Ed Weimer of Scottsbluff, Nebraska; four grandchildren Tim Parsons, Brandon Burt, Kayla Pyle, and Tiffany Pyle all of Torrington; and his dogs Ginger, Scooter, and Maxi.
