The family moved to Casper, Wyoming when Albert was a young child. He grew up and received his education in Casper, graduating from Natrona County High School with the class of 1931. He went on to graduate from the University of Wyoming in 1938 majoring in Commerce. Albert married Wyoming native Dorothy Campbell of Torrington in 1950 in Cheyenne, Wyoming and the couple resided in Laramie, Wyoming until 1954 when Albert became a radar instructor at Ft. Monmouth, New Jersey. One of Al's proudest moments was having a small part as a radar technician tracking the Apollo XI flight, The First Lunar Landing Mission, in July of 1969. He had previously learned about electronics while serving in the Army Air Corps during WWII. The couple retired to El Paso, Texas in 1974 where they were active at the Wellington Chew Senior Center. His wife

passed away in 1983 and Al resided in El Paso until 2003 when he moved to Peoria, Arizona to live with his daughter; however, Al's heart was always in Wyoming. He is survived by his two sons, John of El Paso, Texas, and Robert of Chandler, Arizona; a daughter and son-in-law, Edna and Bruce Benware of Peoria, Arizona; six grandchildren, and numerous doting nieces and one nephew. In addition to his parents and his wife, Al was preceded in death by a sister, Francis Hardigan of Laramie, Wyoming and brothers, William C. Kind of Casper, Wyoming, and Henry Kind of Loveland, Colorado.
