



## Albert Lepp

April 11, 1918 - June 28, 2011

Funeral services for ALBERT J. LEPP, 93, will be held at 1pm Tuesday, July 5, 2011 at the First Congregational Church with Reverend Matthew Gordon officiating. Burial will follow in the Valley View Cemetery. Albert died June 28, 2011 at the Goshen Care Center. A memorial has been established to the church. Visitation will be Tuesday from 9am to 11am at the funeral home and the casket will be open at the church prior to the service. Albert was born April 11, 1918 on a ranch seventeen miles north of Torrington, Wyoming the son of John and Katie (Ochsner) Lepp. He grew up and received his education at Happy Hollow Country School north of Torrington. He worked for a time at the CCC camp at Guernsey, Wyoming helping to build Camp Guernsey. He married Helen Ehrlich on December 31, 1940 in Gering, Nebraska. They farmed in the Torrington area most of his life and he enjoyed doing electrical work which he put to use when he built his own house. He retired in 1983 and sold the farm in 1984. Albert enjoyed collecting rocks and bones, and going fishing. He was a member of the First Congregational Church where he served as a Deacon and Trustee. Albert is survived by his wife Helen of Torrington, Wyoming; daughters Peggy Hill of Lingle, Wyoming and Sherlin Foos and her husband Larry of Yoder, Wyoming; a sister Eva Steinmetz of Torrington; a brother Joseph Lepp and his wife Alberta of Riverton, Wyoming; three grandchildren Thad Foos, Brad Foos, and Janet

Hill; and great grandchildren Yasmen, Forest, and Dalton Foos. He was preceded in death by his parents; a brother Henry Lepp; a sister Frieda Stienmetz; and a son-in-law Marvin Hill.
