In 1963 he became an agent for Continental Oil which later became Anderson Brothers. In 1977 his sons joined his brother John and him in the business. Andy loved to work, be at his cabin, be with his grandchildren, and flying his airplane. He loved farming and respected all the local farmers. He was a past Master Mason in Guernsey, Wyoming, a member of the American Legion in Veteran, Wyoming, a member of the VFW in Torrington, and a member of the Wyoming Petroleum

Marketing Association. Andy is survived by two daughters Debi Feagler and her husband Steve, Andrea Janes and her husband Billy all of Torrington; ; two sons, Tom Anderson and Kelly Anderson both of Torrington; two sisters, Ruby Anderson of Omaha, Nebraska and Eleanor Howard of Yoder, Wyoming; a brother John E.
