March 12, 1922 - April 12, 2012

Memorial services for Artyce Lucille Krug, 90, will be held at 2pm Saturday, April 21, 2012 at the First Wyoming United Presbyterian Church in Torrington with Reverend Steven Seng officiating. Artyce died April 12, 2012 at Community Hospital in Torrington and cremation has taken place. Artyce was born March 12, 1922 on the family farm north of Mitchell, the daughter of Roy and Ellen (Emery) Rutter. She grew up and received her early education in Mitchell and when the family moved to Yoder, Wyoming she finished school there. She then attended Chadron State College for one year. She married Walter Krug on August 23, 1941 in Gering. She raised her family and was a homemaker. Artyce loved following her children in their activities, was involved in Scouting, medical self-help, Babe Ruth and Legion Baseball, was past president of the American Legion Auxiliary, worked the fair stand for the Legion, and was on the Torrington Planning Commission. When her children were young the Krug house was the center of activity in the neighborhood. She treated all the children as her own. Artyce is survived by sons Toby Krug and his wife Deanna of Cheyenne, Wyoming, Kenneth Krug of Rapid City, South Dakota, and Richard Krug and his wife Felecia of Aurora, Colorado; an honorary son Bill Stout of Portland, Oregon; a step-sister Geraldine Wright of Whitmore,

California; eight grandchildren; and eight great grandchildren. She was preceded in death by her mother; her father; her step-father W.G. "Red" Pickens; her husband; and infant sister.
