He then attended Eastern Wyoming College for two years, and then Chadron State College where he received a BA in elementary education and physical education. He taught middle school in Ogallala, Nebraska for eight years from 1986 to 1994 and the Torrington Middle School from 1994 till 1999. He coached middle and high school football, and track. He played Little League , Babe Ruth, and Legion baseball. Later after he was too old to play he umpired local and state tournaments games and refereed basketball games.

Bryon enjoyed hunting, fishing, camping, baseball, basketball, track and doing yardwork. He was a member of the Methodist Church, Fellowship of Christian Athletes and the Bethel Baptist Youth Group.

Bryon is survived by a brother Dale Armstrong of Story, Wyoming; three sisters Jackie Peaster of Fredonia, Kansas, Janet Pitman of Tacoma, Washington, and Sharon Harris of Loveland, Colorado; and several nieces and nephews. He was preceded in death by his grandparents; his parents; and a brother Melvin.
