He moved with his family to Cambridge, Nebraska and then to Veteran, Wyoming where he graduated high school. He farmed with his father until 1940 when he entered the Army Air Corps. He was discharged in 1945 and farmed for himself in Veteran until 1948 when he went to work for Service Pipeline where he worked until 1958. Chuck married Mary Gingles in Fairbury, Nebraska on December 17, 1960. He then went to work for the Torrington Post Office and was there until he retired in 1980. He was a member of the Travis Snow Post #5 of the American Legion and the Paul A Johnston Post 2918 of the VFW. Chuck is survived by three stepsons, John Gingles and his wife Cindy of Vienna, Virginia, James Gingles and his wife Ann of Stevens Point, Wisconsin, and Joe Gingles and his wife Patricia of Story, Wyoming; four brothers, C.J. 'Junior' Anderson of Green Valley, Arizona, Bill Anderson of Torrington, Kenneth Anderson and his wife Carol of Modesto, California, and

Edward Anderson and his wife Loretta of Sun City West, Arizona; one sister, Donna Bolger and her husband Harold of Casper, Wyoming; five grand children; and five great grandchildren. He was preceded in death by his parents; his wife; and four brothers.
