Clara and her twin brother, Clarence, were born May 5, 1913 in Eustis, Nebraska to Henry John and Christine Louise (Moritz) Yorges. The family including older brother Kenneth, moved to the family homestead west of Yoder, Wyoming in 1918. Sis, as she was fondly called by most who knew her, graduated from Yoder High School in 1932 and then taught for a short time a various country schools west of Yoder. On August 13, 1936 she married Cleo Leon (Babe) Brown and they resided west of Yoder for several years. In March 1945, the Browns adopted daughter Connie and in April that same year moved to the Brown family homestead west of Hawk Springs, Wyoming. One year later, the Browns welcomed a son, Danny, and the following year were blessed with a second son, Rex. Labor Day 1959, they sold the homestead and moved to a ranch near Hudson, Wyoming where

Clara lived until September 11, 2001 when she moved to Guernsey, Wyoming. Her entire life, Sis loved playing music and playing basketball. Many times she told the story of how, as a young girl, she would climb the ladder on the old windmill and sit on the working platform where she taught herself to play the guitar. She also taught herself to play the piano. She, and husband Babe, played for dances for many years. They played all over southeastern Wyoming from Woods Landing to Lusk to Hubbard's Cupboard and Terrytown, Nebraska. Clara played basketball during her school years and played on a lady's town team until she was in her 40's. On most winter evenings you could find Sis in front of her television cheering for her favorite basketball teams, the Denver Nuggets, the Dallas Mavericks, and the Phoenix Suns. She would also watch to see who would beat the Lakers. Even up until the last two days of her life, she watched her favorite players on each of her teams. Family always knew that if they tried to call her and one of "her teams" was playing, she wouldn't answer the phone, or if she did she probably wouldn't say very much. Clara's passion, however, was her family. She loved her kids, grandkids, great grandkids, brothers, her in-laws, nieces, nephews, and her extended families in Hudson and Guernsey. The visits from friends and family were important to her and she loved every minute spent with loved ones. She remarked many times how blessed she was. She and Babe never thought they would have any children and then she lived long enough to enjoy great grandchildren. Clara is survived by her daughter, Connie (Buck) Patterson of Guernsey, Wyoming; sons, Danny (Arlene) Brown of Riverton, Wyoming and Rex Brown of Newcastle, Wyoming; ten grandchildren; and 23 great grandchildren. She was preceded in death by her husband Cleo; her parents, Henry and Christine Yorges; and two brothers, Kenneth and her twin brother Clarence.
