He joined the US Army and served in Japan and Korea where he was awarded the Bronze Star, Combat Infantry Badge, the Korean Service Medal with five Bronze Service Stars, the Combat Infantry Badge, the Korean Presidential Unit Citation, and the Distinguished Unit Citation. He was discharged from the army as a Staff Sergeant. He returned to Colorado where he married Edna Kechter on April 4, 1953 in Ft. Collins, Colorado. They moved to Canada to farm wheat for two years before returning to Ft. Collins. They moved to Laramie, Wyoming where he worked as the maintenance foreman for Married Student Housing at the University of Wyoming. After he retired, they moved to Torrington, Wyoming in 2012.

Conrad enjoyed gardening and collecting toys.
