Dale died at his home April 12, 2010 and cremation has taken place. Dale was born March 5, 1939 in Scottsbluff, Nebraska the son of Albert and Frieda (Jacoby) Rien. He was baptized and confirmed in the Zion Evangelical Church in Scottsbluff. He grew up on a farm near Minatare, Nebraska where he graduated from High School and later earned his BS in education from Chadron State College. Dale began his teaching career in Benkelman, Nebraska where he met and married Diane Westrand and had three children; Trevor, Troy, and Trisha. He later taught and coached in Arvada, Wyoming; Yoder, Wyoming; Osmond, Nebraska; Hemmingford, Nebraska; Sidney, Nebraska; and Torrington, Wyoming until his retirement. Dale's thirty-six year coaching career was marked by numerous accomplishments including many State Basketball appearances, four State Basketball Championships, and many other coaching awards. Dale was an avid fisherman and supporter of High School Athletics. He enjoyed spending time with his many friends, and cherished the time he spent with his seven grandchildren. Dale is survived by sons, Trevor Rien (his wife Karla and daughters Paige and Tessa) of Lincoln, Nebraska, Troy Rien (his wife Lisa and sons Devin, Alex, and Jacob) of Lincoln; daughter Trisha Bates (her

husband Shad and daughters Madison and Morgan) of Torrington, Wyoming; and sister Judy Kechter (husband Mike) of Rupert, Idaho. He was preceded in death by his parents, Albert and Frieda Rien.
