Dennis was born September 26, 1945 in Portland, Oregon the son of Joe and Mary (Hergert) Greenwald. They moved to Lingle, Wyoming when he was young and he grew up and received his education and graduating high school there. He attended Chadron State College for two years. He married Linda Cottier on May 31, 1966 and later in life they divorced. He entered the National Guard and received his basic training in Aberdeen, Maryland. After the military they moved back to Lingle where he farmed with his father for many years. In the early 80's he obtained his license as a commodities/futures broker and was a partner in "Interstate Futures" in Torrington. He retired in 2003. In his retirement he ventured into acquiring and breeding bucking bulls. Dennis was an avid golfer, enjoyed playing cards and was a lifelong music lover. He was a past member of the Lingle Volunteer Fire Department and served on many boards and directorships in the area. Dennis is survived by a son Bryan Greenwald and his wife Kelly of Lingle, Wyoming; a daughter DeLynn

Greenwald of Denver, Colorado; his mother Mary Greenwald of Lingle; a sister Mary Lou Brott and her husband Richard of Lingle; two grandsons, Barry Greenwald and Rhett Greenwald. He was preceded in death by his father.
