They lived in Napa, California for twenty years. Floyd died in 1988 and she moved back to Torrington in 1994. She married Martin

Schaneman Jr. on February 14, 1995 and he died in 2007. Both sets of her grandparents came to Goshen County to homestead south of Ft. Laramie in the Harmony Heights area. The Reffalts in 1914.
