Funeral services for ELEANOR M. MCCARTY WERNER, 80, will be held at 2pm Friday, July 8, 2011 at the United Methodist Church with Reverend Ora Dailey officiating. Burial will follow in the Valley View Cemetery. Eleanor died July 3, 2011 at the Goshen Care Center. Eleanor was born June 10, 1931 in Oberlin, Kansas the daughter of Francis and Lulu (Witt) Huntley. She grew up and received her education in Oberlin graduating high school there. She then attended three years at McCook Junior College in McCook, Nebraska. She married Melvin McCarty April 24, 1955 in Oberlin, Kansas. They moved to a ranch southeast of Wheatland, Wyoming where there was no electricity or running water. They were hauled out five years in a row and lost the ranch. They moved to the Lyman, Nebraska area for a time before buying a home in Torrington, Wyoming in 1975. She worked in accounts receivable for the Lamb Construction and the City of Torrington. Melvin died in 1991. She married Earl Werner on September 26, 1992 in Torrington. She retired from the City of Torrington in 1995 and moved to Earl's ranch west of Yoder, Wyoming. In 2007 they moved to Torrington. Earl died in 2009. Eleanor was a member of the Methodist Church, Happy Hour Club, and Circle 4. She was a master gardener and a Sunday School teacher. She enjoyed gardening, quilting, and especially spending time with her family.

Eleanor is survived by a daughter Mary McCarty of Torrington, Wyoming; two sons Gene McCarty and his wife Sandy of Laramie, Wyoming and Robert McCarty of Torrington; two step-sons Jim Werner and his wife Emma of Hawk Springs, Wyoming and David Werner of Glendale, Arizona; a step-daughter Joyce Kirchhefer of Yoder, Wyoming; six grandchildren; and seventeen great grandchildren. In addition to her husbands she was preceded in death by her parents; a brother Wayne Huntley; and two sisters LaVay Dickson and Barbara Jewell.
