Elna Mae moved to Petaluma, California in 1982 and then to Greybull, Wyoming in 1988. She married Edward "Homer" Cheeney on April 17, 1991. He died in 2000. She moved to Torrington, Wyoming in 2001. Elna Mae loved to quilt, do crafts, bake, and dance. She collected hats, friends, and family. She was a member of the Quilt Guild, the Sun Bonnet Gals, and several Bible study groups.
