In 1982 she married the love of her life, Alan, who stood by her side every day of their 42-year marriage. She'd also offer you a bed to sleep in and (of course) a delicious homemade meal.

In 2012 tragedy struck with the sudden and devastating loss of her son, John Giggey.
