We remained very close friends through high school. A few yrs. after graduating, Everete joined the Airforce and I went to school. But we remained in contact and kept our friendship alive. Our high school football, Coach, B.I. Pinchack, often referred to us as the "Gold Dust Twins". Everette would stop and visit with me on his way back home to see his Mother, brothers and sisters, whom he loved unconditionally. On these trips back home he always took the time to go and visit my Mom. That "made her day". After these visits, Mom delighted in telling me that Everette had stopped by to see her.
