He grew up and attended school at Guernsey; graduating Guernsey-Sunrise High School in 1951. He then worked for a short time with the Rail Road before enlisting in the US Army. He served in the Korean Conflict. Following his discharge, Franklin returned to the Guernsey area where he worked the iron ore mines at Sunrise. He married Juanita M. Lay on July 5, 1957 in Gering, Nebraska and the couple lived in Sunrise and Torrington for a short time. They divorced in 1961. Franklin moved back to Guernsey where he continued to work at the mines. He married Peggy Huston on July 28, 1972 in Wheatland, Wyoming and the couple lived at Guernsey. Franklin continued to work at the mines until he retired in the late 1970's. Franklin enjoyed fishing and hunting. He liked wood working projects and he loved to dance. Franklin found great pleasure in socializing and he enjoyed coffee and chat with his Rail Road buddies. He is survived by his wife, Peggy
