George is survived by two sons, Bryan Borton and his wife Nancy of Torrington, and Bruce Borton and his wife Becky of Newcastle, Wyoming; two daughters, Kay Miller and her husband Ron of Scottsbluff, Nebraska and Karol Garduno and her husband David of Minatare, Nebraska; a brother Al Borton of Hamilton, Michigan; six grandchildren, Brandi Borton, Seiley Mann, Garrett Borton, Cory Borton and his wife Blue, Heidi Schultz and her husband Chuck, and Ceasar Garduno;
