George enjoyed fishing, hunting, traveling, and spending time with his family. He played the mouth harp and the Jew's harp. George is survived by a daughter Lois Kirschenman of Menno, South Dakota; four sons, Edwin Burgess of Casper, Wyoming, Fred Burgess of Waxahachie, Texas; Carl Burgess of Mesa, Arizona and George Burgess Jr. of Gillette, Wyoming;
