He was born George Taylor in Scotts bluff, NE. to the parents of Jesse and Edith (Musick) Taylor on January 25, 1921. He received his education and graduated in Scotts bluff in 1939. He joined the military in 1942 and served in WWII until he was honorably discharged in 1946. After the war he met and married his first wife Florence Williamson in 1948 in Scottsbluff, NE. The couple then moved to Colorado Springs where George ran a furniture store for many years before moving to Torrington, WY. They lived there at the time of her passing in 1999. George met and married his second wife Marjorie Parish in Ft. Laramie in 2003 and resided in Torrington, WY. until his death. He loved woodworking, fused glass projects, and loved making birdhouses, as well as watching and feeding birds. He was kind hearted and caring with all around him. George was a member of the Elks in Scotts bluff, American Legion, and a member of the First Baptist

Church in Torrington, WY. He is survived by his wife, Marjorie Taylor of Torrington, WY, one sister Ruth Masid of Scotts Bluff, NE, two step-daughters, Wilma and Dale Russell of Golden, CO, and Kay Ferguson of Englewood, CO, and a step-son Dick and Madeline Shappell of Cheyenne, WY. He was preceded in death by his parents, three sisters, Mildred, Gertrude, and May, and two brothers, Everett and Gene.
