April 10, 1917 - January 10, 2015

Funeral services for Gertrude E. Beierle, 97, will be held at 10am Saturday, Jan. 17, 2015 at the First Congregational Church with Reverend Matt Gordon officiating. Private family burial in Valley View Cemetery will follow the services. Gertrude died Jan. 10, 2015 at Heritage Estates in Gering. A memorial has been established to the First Congregational Church. She worked for 28 years as a cook for the Goshen County School District retiring in 1988.

She enjoyed Bingo, playing cards, watching movies, square dancing, knitting, sewing, and traveling. She volunteered at the hospital, the church, the Senior Friendship Center and also served as a football camp cook and a 4-H leader.
