Harry loved to work on his craft of knitting, he loved music, nature, the Alaskan mountains, and loved to talk on the phone. Survivors included his mother Shirley and her husband Larry, brother Joe Thirlwell and his wife Genita, and sister Carol and her husband Pat Munger, all of Torrington, WY, five daughters; Melody Sayan of Anchorage, AK, Bianca Lopaz of North Carolina, Tina Riley of Rockport, TX, Misty
