Burial will follow in the Valley View Cemetery. Howard died at the Ruby Memorial Hospital in Morgantown, West Virginia on October 8, 2007. Howard was born December 30, 1926 in Johnstown, Colorado the son of Guy and Stella (Northholm) Redabaugh. He grew up and received his education in Colorado graduating from Englewood High School. He attended Colorado State University in Ft. Collins, Colorado where he received a BA in Science in Agronomy. He entered the military where he served in the U.S. Army. He married Velma Meek in Lamar, Colorado on October 22, 1955. Howard worked for the Holly Sugar Corporation for thirteen years as an Agriculturist. They moved to Torrington in 1976 and he retired in 1982. They moved to Katy, Texas in 2003. Velma died in November of 2004 and he moved to Morgantown, West Virginia in 2005. Howard loved to watch the Denver Broncos. He was a member of the East Gate Baptist Church and the Simonton Community Church in Katy, Texas. Howard is survived by a daughter Linda Haddock and her husband Chris of Morgantown; a son Scott Redabaugh and his wife Debbie of Oakton,

Virginia; four granddaughters, Amy Haddock of Colorado, Springs, Colorado, Lindsay Racca of Houston, Texas, Brittany Haddock of Morgantown, and Kristina Redabaugh of Oakton; and two sisters, Mae Keating of North Bend, Washington, and Fern Lohry of Estes Park, Colorado. In addition to his wife Velma he was preceded in death by his parents; sisters Eva Osborn, and Wilma Beeten; and a brother Norman Redabaugh.
