He lived with his family on various farms outside of Cornell until his family moved to Torrington, Wyoming in 1928. They then farmed in the Torrington area and as Hubert grew up he helped on the farm along with his brothers and sisters. Hubert met Esther Watson in Torrington and the couple were wed in the Baptist Church on January 17, 1947. They farmed for several years thereafter in the Torrington area, Gordon, Nebraska, and Mirage Flats, Nebraska. In 1963 Hubert started

work as a custodian at the Veteran School and he remained in this capacity as the local schools consolidated. He retired in December of 1987 from Southeast Schools. Hubbie also drove school bus routes and activity buses during his tenure. Over the years, Hubert enjoyed teasing and joking with the students and teachers alike. He and Esther were heavily involved in the community and for many years they attended the South Goshen Presbyterian Church; continuing their involvement even after moving to Torrington. The George and Carrie Terrell family was very close and most holidays were spent together. Hubert enjoyed dancing, camping, playing cards, bowling, visiting and community service. He was a member of the IOOF, Farmers Union, and the Veteran Fire Department. Hubert was a life well-lived and his laughter and joking nature are remembered by his many friends and relatives. He is survived by his wife of 65 years, Esther, who has lovingly cared for him these past few years in his failing health. He is also survived by his three children, daughter, Carol Troutt and her fiancé, Pat Corley, son, Del Terrell and his wife Amelia, and daughter, Connie Terrell; four grandchildren and seven great grandchildren; one brother, Marvin Terrell, and two sisters, Bernice Riley and Chloa DeVoge. He was preceded in death by his parents, five sisters and their husbands, four brothers and their wives, and several nieces and nephews.
