Isis and Earl grew wheat, alfalfa and raised cattle, sheep, and pigs. Isis loved working outside in the fields and with the animals. She drove wheat trucks, plowed fields, and cut hay. She was asked, "Don't you get tired?" and she would say, "I am never tired.". Isis life revolved around her family, her home, and her land. She was a very good

cook, and her pies and apple dumplings were favorites. She especially enjoyed cooking for her family on the holidays. She was a giving and beautiful person both inside and out.
