He attended Swift and Company cattle buyer training school where he graduated first in his class. He worked as a cattle buyer for Swift and Company and lived in Dixon and Kewanee, IL. The couple then moved to Torrington, Wyoming in 1985. Jim worked for Sterling Beef and then retired from Excell Corporation as a cattle buyer in 2006. Jim was an avid outdoorsman, fisherman, and hunter. He especially enjoyed hunting geese. Jim also enjoyed playing cards with his friends. He was a member of the St. Rose Catholic Church and was also a past member of the Jaycees. Jim supported numerous private conservation organizations. Survivors include his wife Carol of Torrington, two sons, James Palmer Jr. and his wife Kim, and their children, Melissa and Michelle of Princeton, Missouri,

and Chris Palmer and his wife Chelese and their children Kaylen, Micah, Maryn, and Danae of Sterling, IL, and one brother David Palmer of Dixon, IL. He was preceded in death by his parents.
