He helped construct and then worked at Skate City until it closed. He started working at the Eastern Wyoming College where he was the evening supervisor at the Student Center for thirteen years. Jerry loved photography and playing, umpiring, and coaching baseball and softball. He started and was heavily involved in Youth Skate Hockey at Skate City. He loved camping and backpacking with his family; especially with his daughter; in the Big Horn

Mountains. His favorite pastime was spending time with his daughter Tessa. Jerry is survived by his parents Jerry and Judy Lamb of Torrington, Wyoming; daughter TesSaundra Ann Lamb of Torrington; a sister Valerie Sharp and her husband Ray of Rock Springs, Wyoming; his paternal grandmother Margaret Lamb of Torrington; and his beloved dog Socks Little Bit. He was preceded in death by his paternal grandfather; and his maternal grandparents.
