In 1955 Jerry went to work for Lamb Construction doing road construction throughout the state and around Manville. Jerry married Judy Jassman at Manville on June 28, 1959. In 1970 the couple moved to Torrington where Jerry continued to work with Lamb Construction until 1986. He then went to work for Abbott Construction-Platte County Concrete in Casper and Wheatland, Wyoming. He retired in 2005. Jerry was a member of the Torrington American Legion and a life member of the Community Hospital

Auxiliary. He enjoyed his family and especially his granddaughter, Tessa. Jerry loved the Big Horn Mountains and camping, backpacking and fishing. He liked mechanic-ing in his shop and keeping up the yard. He enjoyed drives in the country, morning coffee at Main Street Market, and lunch at the Senior Friendship Center. Jerry is survived by his wife of 53 years, Judy, of Torrington; his daughter Valerie (Ray) Sharp of Rock Springs, Wyoming; granddaughter, TesSaundra Lamb of Johnstown, Colorado; his mother, Margaret Lamb of Torrington; three brothers; including his twin brother, Gary, (LaLa) Lamb of Lusk, Wyoming; Jack (Ellen) Lamb also of Lusk, and Larry (Patty) Lamb of Douglas, Wyoming; two sisters, Bobetta (George) Etchemendy of Lost Springs, Wyoming, and Bonnie (Wayne) King of Lead, South Dakota; and many nieces, nephews, and cousins.
