LINGLE, WYOMING.....Memorial services for JOSEPH 'JOE' WILLIAM FRANKS, 53, will be held at 10am Saturday, June 21, 2008 at the First Wyoming United Presbyterian Church in Torrington, Wyoming, with Reverends Curtis Hill and Amado Lobatos co-officiating. Joe died June 16, 2008 from injuries sustained in a motorcycle accident. Cremation has taken place. Memorials have been established to either the Lingle Presbyterian Church or the Goshen Community Theater. Joe, born May 15, 1955, in Torrington, Wyoming, was the son of William and Patricia Ann (Floyd) Franks. He grew up and received his education in Lingle, Wyoming; he graduated in 1973. He attended the University of Wyoming before returning to Lingle where he spent his life farming. He married Robyn Loveland on December 31, 1980 and they were married for twenty years. He later married Cindy Sorensen and they were together for two years. Joe was one of the founding members of the Stateline Bean Cooperative and was a member of the Goshen Community Theater. Joe enjoyed boating, astronomy, performing in various local productions and singing in church choirs. Joe is survived by two daughters, Haley Oliver and her husband Dusty of Lodi, New York, and Cora Franks of Lingle, Wyoming; two sons, Graham Franks and Mathew Franks both of Lingle; his father, William Franks of Lingle; a sister Georgie Hunter of Gillette, Wyoming, and a nephew, Grant Hunter and his wife, Meghan, of Cleveland,

Ohio. He was preceded in death by his mother; and a brother.
