LINGLE, WYOMING.....Funeral services for KENNETH R. PURSLEY 94, will be held at 10:30am Thursday, June 4, 2009 at the Community Presbyterian Church in Lingle with Reverend Curtis Hill officiating. Burial will follow in the Hillcrest Cemetery. Kenneth died June 1, 2009 at Community Hospital in Torrington, Wyoming. Memorials may be made to the Church or to Evergreen Court. Kenneth was born January 22, 1915 in Lafayette, Indiana to John Sheridan and Eva (Misner) Pursley. The family moved to Wyoming in 1929 where they settled in the Plainview Community southwest of Lingle, Wyoming. He graduated from Veteran High School in 1932. Kenneth married Margaret Johnson in February of 1936 and the couple remained best friends for 67 years until her death in 2003. He then served with the CCC before going to work for Stanlin Pipeline. This job kept them on the move around Wyoming and Nebraska until 1950 when he bought his parents farm. The farm remained their home until they retired and moved into Lingle in 1980. He moved into Evergreen Court in October of 2007. Kenneth enjoyed several years serving on the board for Wyrulec. He was an active member of the Lingle Lions Club and the Community Presbyterian Church where he served in many areas. Kenneth is survived by daughters, Lenore (Ralph) Bremer and Susan (Larry) Wilson of Lingle, Wyoming; son Jay (Barb) Pursley

of Torrington, Wyoming; 10 grandchildren; 15 great grandchildren; five great-great grandchildren; and many nieces, nephews, and good friends. He was preceded in death by his wife; one son, Melvin (Bud); one grandson; one granddaughter; two sisters; and four brothers.
