She was born on November 6, 1917 on her fathers homestead west of Torrington, the daughter of Julius and Stella (Stout) Sishc. She attended Lingle schools and graduated second in her class of 1936. She played basketball, won blue ribbons in javelin throws, was a fast runner, and a cheer leader at the football games. Lillie was the first secretary for the SISHC MANUFACTURING COMPANY in Torrington for the years of 1937 to 1944. She married Eugene Warthen September 8, 1945. Their daughter Peggy was born. They later divorced. She remarried to Arthur (Pat) Foreman on December 24, 1947, and two sons were born to this union. Lillie taught the nursery class at the First Presbyterian Church for many years. She made a craft for the children every Sunday. Lillie also belonged to the church ladies groups where craft items were made for different occasions. She moved from Torrington to Denver in the 80's to be closer to her daughter and son. She was the care-taker for 55 years for her son Gary. She taught him to weave rugs, crafts, and to be self motivated. Lillie is survived by her daughter, Peggy and husband Frank Mercer, sons Don and his wife Sheri, and Gary Foreman,

all of Aurora, CO, brothers Howard Sishc of Gering, NE, and John Sishc of Torrington, WY, sisters Hazel Malone of Yoder, WY, and Bethel and her husband Jim Nolan of Denver, CO, as well as a host of nieces and nephews. She was preceded in death by her parents, one brother Chester, one sister Marie, and both husbands.
