Lois was a member of the First Wyoming United Presbyterian Church where she served in many leadership posts. She was a seventy-seven year member of the Order of Eastern Star, a Past Matron, and a Past Bethel Guardian of Job's Daughters. Lois is survived by a son Roger Hunter and his wife Darla of Fort Collins, Colorado; a daughter, Lynne Ainsworth and her husband Jack of Sierra Vista, Arizona, seven grandchildren, Raymond Hunter, Michele (Shane)
