He always had lots of friends during watermelon season. Louis delighted in showing people his "magic" knives and making people laugh.

Louis met the love of his life at a school dance where he was performing. He played a number of musical instruments. Louis and Elizabeth (Betty) were married June 11, 1950. They lived all their lives on the homestead. They had

three beloved children, Lindsey (Betty), Linda (Larry) York of Hawk Springs and Barry of Torrington. He had two grandsons, Brandon (Courtney) York of Cheyenne, Wyoming and Dan Arnold of Torrington. He also had two great grandsons, Lance and Mason York of Cheyenne. He is survived by a sister Ruby (George) Oschner and family of Torrington and sister-in-law Marilyn Johnson and family of Denver, Colorado and is survived by his cat Blackie. He was preceded in death by his parents; brother Leroy; sister Lila; brothers-in-law Lloyd Craton and RV Johnson; and daughter-in-law Linda Arnold.
