He attended grade school in Laird and then graduated from high school at Wray, Colorado. He enlisted in the Army Air Corps and served in the Pacific Theater during WWII. He married Oleta Mae Faihtinger on July 29, 1944 in Fresno, California. Following his discharge from the service, the couple moved to Wray, Colorado and then to Limon, Colorado where Lyle was a lineman for REA.; later transferring to Potter, Nebraska in 1962. The couple then moved to Sidney, Nebraska and Lyle went to work for Cabela's until his retirement in 1984. They then lived at Ada, Oklahoma before moving to Torrington, Wyoming in 1994. Lyle was a Cub Scout leader and Boy Scout leader; and he coached baseball for many years in Limon, Colorado and Potter, Nebraska. He enjoyed fishing and hunting. Lyle was a member of the Torrington VFW Paul A Johnston Post 2918. He is survived by his wife, Oleta of Torrington; a daughter Lana Jean Smith and her husband John of

Ada, Oklahoma; two sons, Ronald Dean Halley and his wife Linda of Torrington, Wyoming, and Lyle 'Kent' Halley and his wife Pam of Mitchell, Nebraska; 10 grandchildren and 11 great grandchildren. He was preceded in death by his parents; one brother, Dale; and one sister, Wanda Williams.
