She taught school in Phillips County until 1930 when she married Harry DeBolt on December 15, 1930 in Sterling, Colorado. They traveled by car to Epsom, Indiana to see Harry's parents and then returned to live in Scottsbluff, Nebraska from 1930 until 1937 when they moved to Torrington to open Goshen Implement in 1937. They sold it and retired in 1963. Majel was a member of the Methodist Church for over fifty years. She was past president of Junior Women's Club, Torrington Women's Club, Community Dames and WCSC (United Methodist Women). She loved to read, crochet, work in her yard and garden. Majel especially enjoyed singing in the church choir because she loved music. Majel is survived by a son Max

DeBolt of Torrington; a daughter Elaine DeBolt of Bella Vista, Arkansas; a daughter-in-law, Janice DeBolt of Grand Junction, Colorado; eleven grandchildren and thirty great grandchildren.
