The family lived on a farm near Morrill, Nebraska and then later moved to a farm near Veteran, Wyoming where Mary Alyce received her education; graduating from Veteran High School in 1958. She then lived on the family farm until 1987 when she moved to Torrington where she was a client at D.S.I. She began in a group home and transitioned to her own apartment in 1990 which became her pride and joy. Her happy smile and big waves, as people passed by outside of her apartment complex, will be missed by the community. With the beginning of Mary Alyce's services at DSI; she learned skills and jobs in laundry service, school lunch programs, and janitorial crews. Perhaps the job sites that brought her the greatest joy were at the Torrington Livestock and Stockman's Livestock where Mary Alyce enjoyed opportunities to see and visit with local farmers and ranchers. She continued at the

salebarns until her retirement in 2002. She then volunteered for several more years at Torrington Livestock handing out apples to auction bidders. Mary Alyce enjoyed puzzles, reading the newspapers, and making craft projects for the Goshen County Fair each year. She loved animals and her D.S.I. family. She had collections of wind chimes, skunks, frogs, cows, Garfield and Dalmatians, or her "fire dogs". She was especially interested in keeping up with her family's happenings and she enjoyed her church. Most of all, Mary Alyce loved following the Torrington Trailblazers season schedules. She knew where they played, who they played, and what the scores were! She is survived by her two sisters, Janet Hamner of Grand Junction, Colorado, and Ann (Gary) Carver of Cheyenne, Wyoming; her sister-in-law, Willene Curry of Torrington; three nieces, Tracy (Mark) Hergert of Lingle, Wyoming, Deb (Scot) Christofferson of Portland, Oregon, and Cindy (Rob) Mossey of Cheyenne; and three nephews, Chuck (Deb) Curry of Torrington; Brent Hamner of Grand Junction, Colorado; and Steve (Caroline) Carver of Cheyenne, Wyoming. She was preceded in death by her parents and one brother, Bob Curry.
