He grew up and attended school; graduating Torrington High School in 1983. While in high school Max played football and basketball and was a member of 4-H and FFA; but he mostly enjoyed high school rodeo. He attended Black Hills State University at Spearfish, South Dakota for three years and then the University of Wyoming for two years. Max then moved to Hawaii and worked with his brother Craig at Triton Marine Construction for three years; and during that time Max traveled a wide area with the company. He returned home and worked with his father on the family farm briefly before going back into construction for a few years. Max then worked for Long Electrical for about three years and was currently working as a journeyman electrician for Platte Valley Electrical at the time of

his death. Max enjoyed golfing and hunting. He liked music and especially enjoyed being with his friends and nieces and nephews. He was a member of the Torrington Order of the Moose Lodge. He is survived by his father, Glen Erdman of Torrington; his mother Lana Erdman of Lingle, Wyoming; sister, Dainah McCreery of Lingle; brother, Craig Erdman of Casper, Wyoming; his companion, Kyra Barker of Torrington; and six nieces and nephews, Dondi, David, Evan, Chase, Katie, and Deidre; and three great nephews, and two great nieces. He was preceded in death by his paternal grandparents, Henry and Molly Erdman and his maternal grandparents, Bill and Ida Gibson.
