Max Eugene Fisher, 76, died Monday, July 9, 2012 at Community Hospital in Torrington, Wyoming. Memorial services will be held at 1 p.m. Saturday, July 14, at the United Methodist Church with Reverend Ora Dailey officiating. Cremation has taken place. There will be a reception at the Moose Lodge following the service. Max was born November 22, 1936, in Hemingford, Nebraska the son of Arthur and Mary (Fowler) Fisher. He lived on a farm, in Hemingford, with his parents and siblings until he graduated high school. After high school, he attended Chadron State College where he participated in the music program. In college, he met and married Norma Green. The couple had three children and after 29 years of marriage, divorced. In 1954, Max started his 36 year career with Western Airlines (which later became Delta Airlines). He was proud to be a part of keeping the airline involved with the Alaskan Pipeline. In 1987 he married Wanda Nascimento. The couple lived in Denver and upon his retirement, in 1995, they moved to Torrington. Max enjoyed camping, boating and taking cross country trips on his motorcycle. He loved working on old VW's and motorcycles. He was definitely a "tinkerer". Max was involved with youth ministries for the Methodist Church. He was a member of the United Methodist Church, Toastmasters, and the Moose Lodge. He is survived by his wife Wanda Fisher of Torrington; daughter Tammy (Randy) Foltz of Cleveland, OH; son Ted (Kris)

Fisher of Denver, CO; step-son Randy (Linda) Nascimento of Oakdale, CA; step-son Anthony Nascimento of McCall, ID; step-daughter Melissa Nascimento of Anchorage, AK; 11 grandchildren and 12 great grandchildren. Preceding him in death are his parents; six brothers and sisters; and his oldest son, Tim Fisher.
