October 15, 1920 - June 9, 2012

Maxine was born on October 15, 1920 in Alliance, NE the daughter of Elmer Lee and Josephine Marsh. She received her early education in Box Butte County rural schools and completed the High School Equivalency Program at St Agnes High School. Maxine and John C. Huff were united in marriage November 12, 1938. John's life was taken in a plane crash during the 1949 blizzard while flying medications to stranded ranchers and farmers. Maxine then pursued a career at St. Joseph's Hospital as a medical secretary. On July 4, 1952 she married Edward Cremin who preceded her in death in 1989. Moira Cremin Rost, their daughter, survives, in addition to Steven Rost, their grandson, and two great grandchildren, Kayla and Maranda. One brother, Bill Marsh of Torrington, WY also survives. Preceding her in death were her parents, four brothers: Roy, Glen, Jack, and Fred; and four sisters: Irene, Sybil, Nadine and Darlyne. Twenty eight nephews and nieces also mourn her passing.
