Milton was born September 30, 1939 in Coquille, Oregon the son of Milton and Hallie (Park) Rodgers Sr. He moved at an early age to Bandon, Oregon where he received his education and lettered in baseball four years. After his senior year he entered the military. Upon his discharge he went to Montana where he worked as a core layer in a plywood plant. He moved to Oregon where he worked in plywood plants in Reedsport and Florence. He met Deborah Young in Florence and they were married in Winnemucca, Nevada on July 6, 1971. They built a house next to the golf course in Florence and in 1975 they moved to Lynch, Wyoming for one year. They moved to Torrington, Wyoming where he worked for Wyrulec Company until he became disabled in 1985. Milton enjoyed many things among them golfing, fishing, archery, making jewelry, boating, snow skiing, playing guitar, and was an accomplished wood carver. He was a member of Bethel Baptist Church. He was an assistant Little League baseball coach, served as AWANA Commander for many years, and served as US CoDirector of International

Ministry-Healing for the Nations for five years. Milton is survived by his wife Deborah of Torrington, Wyoming; two sons, Stewart Rodgers and his wife Catrina of Spearfish, South Dakota and Jeffrey Rodgers and his fiancée Tracy Benson of Torrington; a sister Carlene Scorby and her husband Gary of Bandon, Oregon; and eight grandchildren. He was preceded in death by his parents.
