He was born on August 23, 1925 at Cassa, Wyoming to Ivan Stanley and Nellie Marie(Thurman) Hooley. He graduated from Glendo High School in 1943 and received his PhD. of Pharmacy from Colorado University, Boulder, CO in June 1950. Quentin joined the Army in Korea in 1950-51 and worked in pharmacy supplies as a Pharmacy Technician. He owned and operated the HQ Drug Store in Glenrock, WY. He met and married Myrtle Freese in Glenrock on January 22, 1967. They moved to Torrington in 1970 and worked at Kellam Drug and Center Pharmacy. Myrtle later passed away on August 30, 1987. The couple had no children. He was Wyoming State Representative from Converse County from 1965-1967, as well as past president of several clubs and organizations, including Glenrock Lions Club, Glenrock Chamber of

Commerce, Central Pharmaceutical Association, and Casper Pharmaceutical Association. Quentin was a member of the First Baptist Church of Torrington and the Torrington Elks Lodge #1726, Moose Lodge, and Goshen County Country Club. He also belonged to the Masonic Lodge of Torrington #29, Shrine Club of Torrington, as well as Korean Shrine Club for many years. He enjoyed playing piano, playing the mucket, and traveling. Quentin is survived by special friends Mel and Nita Gable and Bonnie Hurst, all of Torrington. He was preceded in death by his parents, his wife, and two brothers Stanley and Kenneth.
