He attended the University of Wyoming for one year. He was very active in 4-H and was a 4-H leader. He married in 1951 and was later divorced. To this union three children were born. On August 8, 1976 he married Beverley Sawyer. In the early 1960's he was chosen as the Outstanding Young Farmer of Wyoming. Bob served on the Yoder and Goshen Hole School Boards, was an elder in the Yoder Presbyterian Church, and a member of the Yoder Volunteer Fire Department. He also served on the Wyrulec Board of Directors, and the Tri-State Board of Transmission and Generation. He was a member of the RCA. Bob is survived by his wife Beverley of Torrington; two sons, Robert N. Yeik and his wife Beverly of Yoder, Wyoming and Daniel David Clyde Yeik of Ft. Laramie, Wyoming; one daughter Diane Irene Hodge and her husband Richard of Mission Viejo, California; two step-daughters, Beckie Havelly and

her husband Pat of Torrington and Robyn Bunten and her husband Robb of Cheyenne Wyoming; a step-son Brad Schuppan and his wife Darla of Ratton, New Mexico; an uncle Gene Yeik of Glenrock, Wyoming; grandchildren, Bryan and Sarah Yeik, Rob and Erin Yeik, Devin Wallace, Tara Jeanne Schuppan, and Katie Hronick; great grandchildren Calista Yeik, Carl Yeik, and Triston Hronick.
