Rosie and Dick were married over 64 years when Dick died in September of 1997 at the age of 92. Through the years, Rosie was a member of the Burge Community Club, the Goshen CowBelles, and the Lutheran Church in both Lusk and in Torrington. She enjoyed music and she played the piano and organ. Rosie and Dick loved to

dance, and she continued to attend dances until the last couple years of her life. Rosie especially enjoyed her grandchildren, great grandchildren and her great-great grandson.
