Tom was born July 8, 1929 in Wheatland, Wyoming the son of Robert and Rosie (Mondragon) Scott. He grew up and received his education in the Wheatland and Torrington areas. He married Norma Jean Goering on March 16, 1949 in Wheatland. He joined the Wyoming Army National Guard and then was put in active duty in the U.S. Army during the Korean Conflict. After his discharge, he returned to Goshen County where he worked on the Teeter's Ranch as ranch foreman. In 1966 he bought in as a partner in the A&C Sheet Metal Shop and later became the sole owner. He retired in 1995 due to ill health. Tom loved to work and was a member of the First Baptist Church, and the Masonic Lodge. Tom is survived by his wife Norma; two sons, Tom Scott and his wife Verna of Cheyenne, Wyoming, and Dwaine Scott and his wife Rita of Torrington, Wyoming; a daughter Diana Hicks of Pine Bluffs, Wyoming; a brother, John Scott of Wheatland, Wyoming; seven sisters, Louise Roberts, Betty James, and Patty
