Burial will follow in the LaGrange Cemetery. Bill died at his home Friday March 9, 2007. Cremation has taken place. Bill was born February 14, 1935 in Omaha, Nebraska the son of Henry and Emily (Riley) Yetter. He moved from Lincoln, Nebraska to LaGrange at a young age and worked for the Broken Box Ranch. He graduated from LaGrange High School in 1954 and then attended the University of Wyoming for a short time before serving in the Wyoming Army National Guard. In 1958 he married June Spath near Lyman, Nebraska, and had three sons, Glen, Scott, and Ken. While living in the LaGrange community Bill was active in many organizations. He served as a volunteer fire fighter and EMT, Commander of the American Legion Post, and was presently a town council member. He was presented the Community Service Award from the Sportsman's Club and was named the Goshen County 4-H Leader of the Year. Bill volunteered for thirty-eight years as a 4-H community or project leader for the Bear Creek Guys and Gals 4-H Club, where he lead a variety of projects, such as rabbit, poultry, sheep, aerospace, entomology, wildlife, leather craft, woodworking , and more. In 1972 Bill

decided instead of a 4-H club tour all the members would bring their projects to the Community Building in LaGrange to show the community what they had been working on. Thus began the Annual LaGrange Mini Fair, now in its thirty-fifth year. He was the guiding force for this annual community event since the beginning. He led horseback trips from LaGrange to Albin Days for thirteen years. His seemingly endless energy and commitment to his family and the community of LaGrange will be dearly missed. Bill always said, ' LaGrange is the best place in the world to live.' Bill is survived by his wife June of LaGrange, three sons, Glen Yetter and his wife Holli of Morrill, Nebraska, Scott Yetter and his wife Dana of LaGrange, and Ken Yetter and his wife Linda of Cheyenne, Wyoming; four grandsons, Brandon Yetter and his wife Mica of Gering, Nebraska, Philip Yetter and his wife Amber of Windsor, Colorado, and Tyler Esp and Michael Esp both of Cheyenne; and three great grandchildren, Noah, Jaelyn, and Michael Yetter. He was preceded in death by his parents; two sisters; one brother; and an infant son.
