April 18, 1918 - July 19, 2009

Wauneta E. Ferrari, 91, died on July 19, 2009 at Life Care Center in Casper, Wyoming. Wauneta was born on April 18, 1918 in Valentine, Nebraska the daughter of Arthur Lincoln and Priscilla Belle (Woolard) Bailey. She grew up and received her education at Valentine. She married Guy Ferrari at Torrington, Wyoming on October 7, 1933. The couple then spent most of their early married life in Goshen County and Western Nebraska before buying their first farm in Veteran, Wyoming in 1953. In 1955, Wauneta went to work at the Goshen County Memorial Hospital in Torrington in the dietary department for a short time before transferring into the business office. She and Guy moved in to Torrington in 1957 and in 1959 Wauneta became the office manager at the hospital. She retired in 1981. In 1998, Wauneta moved to an assisted living facility in Cheyenne, Wyoming for a time before moving back to Torrington to the Goshen Care Center, and then was later transferred to the Life Care Center in Casper. Wauneta loved her yard and flower gardens where she spent many hours each spring and summer. She liked embroidery, crocheting, painting, bowling, and writing poetry. Wauneta also really enjoyed music; dancing, singing, playing guitar and organ. She was a member of the First Wyoming United Presbyterian Church, the Senior Friendship Center, and the Rebekah Lodge. She is survived by her 2 daughters, Mae Belle (Gene) Boyles; and Jeanette (Jim) Pontarolo; 2 sons, David (Kay) Ferrari and Kenneth (Lynda) Ferrari; 10 grandchildren, 27 great grandchildren, and three great-great grandchildren. She was preceded in death by her husband, Guy;

one son-in-law, Ron Darnall, four sisters, and five brothers.
