He went to join the love of his life, Beulah, at God's Airport. William, best known to his friends and family as 'Bill', landed on this earth in Bloomsburg, Pennsylvania on April 29, 1924 the son of Loren and Emma (Broadt) Hileman. He was joined by his siblings, Evelyn, Phyllis, Shirley, Robert and Sandy. While growing up, Bill resided in Lightstreet, Pennsylvania and was employed as a carpenter and also worked at a carpet mill and a flour and sugar mill. In 1942, at the age of 18, Bill entered the United States Army Air Corp, and he was trained as a radio operator, and to "sit in the second seat" which introduced him to his love of flying. In 1945 he met and married Beulah Dark in Pueblo Colorado and this union lasted almost 60 years until Beulah's death in 2004. The couple had two daughters, Peggy and Teri. Bill's chosen profession was a pharmacist which he worked at until 2010. He took great pride in the fact that he was in the first graduating pharmacy class from the University of Wyoming at Laramie and as the years

went by, he was followed through this pharmacy program by both his son-in-law, Joel Jackson and his grandson, Bill Jackson. He and his wife, Beulah, owned and operated the Lingle Drug until retirement and then Bill worked as a fill-in Pharmacist throughout the area. During his lifetime, Bill also became an experienced pilot and flight instructor. These were accomplishments he loved and missed, a lot, later in life. Over the years, Bill got to know and watch his grandsons grow into adulthood. Bill, a pharmacist in Jackson, Wyoming; Dean Brown currently serving in the Army, and Allen Brown who is employed by Trial Lawyers, Inc. out of Tampa, Florida. Bill also got to meet his two great grandsons, David and Logan. Bill is survived by his two daughters and sons-in-law, Peggy and Joel Jackson of Big Spring, Texas and Teri and Doug Armstrong of Torrington, Wyoming; his three grandsons, Bill (Jamie) Jackson; and Dean and Allen Brown; the two great grandsons, David and Logan; a brother, Robert, and two sisters, Shirley and Sandy. We all wish you God's speed on your final flight! You will be missed by many. Bill was preceded in death by his parents, his wife, and two sisters, Evelyn and Phyllis.
